For example, a member may have a contract with a corporate that is now part of the Alloya Corporate FCU family as part of a merger. In a merger of corporate credit unions, the surviving corporate agrees that it will assume all the assets and liabilities, including contracts, of the merging corporate. Therefore, unless otherwise specified, contracts with the name of a corporate that merged into Alloya, including its predecessors, have been assumed by Alloya and are in full force and effect. The following lists the corporates that merged into Alloya:

- Garden State into Empire
- Rhode Island into Empire
- South Dakota into Empire
- Indiana into Mid-States
- Minnesota into Mid-States
- Mid-States and Empire into Members United
- Connecticut into Members United Bridge
- Members United Bridge into Alloya
- CenCorp into Alloya
- Rocky Mountain Corporate into System United Corporate (SunCorp)
- Nebraska Corporate into System United Corporate (SunCorp)
- SunCorp into Alloya
